

## PSMS PTO MEETING MINUTES

- I. WELCOME—Stephanie Sale
- II. SECRETARY’S REPORT—Susan Campbell: Aimee moved to approve the February minutes. Betsy seconded the motion.
- III. TREASURE’S REPORT—Kara Golian and Anil Kumar:  
Treasurer Report for Treasurer Report for 3/2/18. Checking account balance at 2/1/18 - \$40,158.07. Recent deposits include \$583.26 from Hangers for Community Partners. Recent checks written include – \$477.45 to Joe’s Kansas City for staff lunch during conferences, \$95.78 for staff snacks/drinks during conferences, and two checks totaling \$66.34 for teachers participating in the Staff Welcome Back. Our current PTO Invest and Membership in PSMS balance is \$17,570.00 and our 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Farewell balance is \$4,940.00. We have signed up to participate in Amazon Smile. Current donations totaling \$86.19 should be automatically deposited in our bank account in March. Betsy moved to approve the Treasure’s Report and Budget. Susan seconded the motion.

are items to sell. Remaining items will be offered at a discount to incoming 6<sup>th</sup> graders at Parent Meeting. COMMUNICATIONS: Jillaine VonSeldnek will serve as administrator of the PSMS PTO website. She will also manage our FB presence.

- B. 2<sup>ND</sup> VP REPORTS—Aimee Bernstein. COMMUNITY SERVICE—Julie Rudman: We made Valentine's with PSE students and delivered to a retirement facility. Community Service hours are due on April 5<sup>th</sup>. Julie would like to have one more Community Service activity this year. 8<sup>TH</sup> GRADE FAREWELL—Tiffany Way and Amy Perkins: Tiffany has placed a deposit at 4 locations for May 23<sup>rd</sup>, shirts cost will be \$8, and video will be worked on after Winter Break. Eric will get feedback from the 8<sup>th</sup> grade team regarding the possibility of changing the date and procedure of 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Farewell. Amy has prepared the slide show. Students will be expected to dress up for the activity. BVHS is preparing and printing the T-shirts. End of year date will be shared after spring break. Eric will be able to select families that need to be notified who haven't paid. Students are being charged \$35 per student. The charge will be \$45 next year. PANTHER NIGHT/FALL FRENZY—Julie Browne, Mary Garreston, and Tricia Bath: These are completed for the year. No report. HEALTH SCREENINGS: No report. Andrea Myers will be in charge of 2018-2019 Health Screenings.
- C. 3<sup>RD</sup> VP REPORTS—Melanie Marquart. COMMUNITY PARTNERS—Andrea Myers: This position is open for next year. Chipotle is Monday, March 5 from 4-8 on 135<sup>th</sup> and Metcalf. They give us 50%. We will have a second Sonic Night in April. BVEF LIASON—BV raised \$81,000 through Major Saver. BV Well is continuing to share information. SIGN CARETAKER: THE SIGN IS LIT!
