- I. WELCOME—Stephanie Sale
- II. SECRETARY’S REPORT—Stephanie Sale: Aimee moved to approve the March minutes. Andrea seconded the motion. Minutes were approved.
- III. TREASURE’S REPORT—Kara Golian and Anil Kumar: Treasurer Report for April included the following information: Checking account balance at 11/6/17 - \$40,540. Recent deposits include \$483 from community partners (Chipotle, Burger-Fi and Pizzeria Locale . Recent checks written include – \$99 for teacher welcome back and \$300 for taxes. Our current PTO Invest and membership in PSMS balance is \$17,570.00 and our 8th Grade Farewell balance is \$4,940.00. Betsy moved to approve the Treasure’s Report and Budget for April. - VI. PSMS ADMINISTRATION REPORT—Eric shared that A young man approached him with the idea of a fundraiser at an Escape Room—Andrea will look into that option. Last day of school is officially Friday, May 25th with a 10:50 dismissal. Busy end of the year with events the next 3 Fridays. April 13th is the Sunflower Ambassador Assembly. April 27th the 8th graders will have the opportunity to listen to Sonia Warshawski (of the documentary Big Sonia) speak.
